RS76 | London Games 2012...

During the London 2012 Olympic games, some 50km (30 miles) of roads were kept solely for Olympic athletes, staff and journalists. These special lanes were demanded by the International Olympic Committee after the Atlanta games in 1996, when athletes missed events because of traffic delays. RETENTION SYSTEM™ sockets were used by TfL (Transport for London) for the temporary installation of information signs on all routes throughout the city. After the games, the signs were removed quickly and easily without any expensive or disruptive excavation. All RS sockets were plugged and pavements left safe and clutter free ready for any future signage installation.
